**Course content:**

On this course you will study:

- A Further 10 Optional units studied , over the two years

**Facilities for students:**

Students are taught on the Main Pelham tower site, using class rooms where work can be displayed and practical demonstrations can take place.

Students are placed in industry placements arranged and monitored by the Health and Social Care Team

**Tutors:**

We have fantastic team of Health and Social Care professionals that have all worked in the industry and bring these experiences into their lessons.

**Assessment:** Each unit has an end assignment which needs to be completed and passed in order to achieve the qualification.

**Awarding Body:** Edexcel

**Entry Requirements:**

Students must have gained Four C grade at GCSE and, one of these must be in English (please also note that if you wish to go on to University you will need to hold C grade or higher in Maths and Science.

**Interview for entry:** Interview required

**Progression and links:**

Once you have achieved a National Diploma you can enter Employment or you may go on to University and train to become a Social Worker, Nurse or even a Primary School teacher.

You could gain employment as a level three practitioner.
