Course Structure and Content

The course allows for three options:

Option A

General English classes for 15 hours a week in the mornings. The lessons cover a wide range of English language skills with the aim of improving your confidence and ability to use English. The teachers use a variety of methods in the classroom including videos, role play and other activities, as well as studying newspapers and television programmes. There is also extensive use of specialist computer programmes aimed at English language learners. There is a relaxed and friendly atmosphere, excellent and experienced teachers and a good mix of nationalities so that learning will also be enjoyable.

Option B

IELTS classes for 6 hours a week on two afternoons a week. This course is for students who want to go on to study at a UK college or university and who need to meet a formal entry requirement. It aims to improve ability to communicate in English across all four language skills -listening, reading, writing and speaking. It will draw heavily on practice papers to provide you with the knowledge, skills and techniques you need to give you the greatest chance of success in the shortest time. Students may take the test at the end of the course. The cost of the examination is approximately £120.

Option C

Option A plus Option B = 21 hours per week.

The cost of the course includes all tuition for 6, 15 or 21 hours per week.

Entry Requirements

To enrol on this course you must:

- be aged 16 or over at the beginning of July 2010
- be at a minimum of elementary level - Please note: We DO NOT take beginners
- return your application by the end of June 2010
- send a deposit of £500 or a payment of the full tuition fee, whichever amount is lower
- if you require a general student visa, you must study a minimum of 15 hours

The courses are based at Pelham Tower, Brighton, which is one of the main buildings of the College. The College is about 10 minutes walk from the centre of the city and the beach. It has well-equipped modern classrooms.
