Reset my computer password if I have forgotten it?

Access my college files from home?

Read my College email from home?

Visit <http://portal.ccb.ac.uk>. Click “Student email” in the main menu on the left hand side of the screen.

Get a replacement Student ID card?

Visit the Enrolment Centre on the Ground Floor of Pelham or the issue desk in the Pelham LRC. You will be charged £2.00 for a replacement card.

Get a letter confirming I am a student for Council Tax or benefit purposes?

Contact the Enrolment Centre on the Ground Floor of Pelham.

Change my address with the College?

Email enrolment@ccb.ac.uk with your new details or visit the Enrolment Centre and fill out a Change of Details form.

Pay a library fine?

Try to pay any library fines as soon as possible. You can do this at the issue desk in the Pelham or City College East LRC.

Find out about financial assistance?
